In response to our 'Returning to In-person Worship Survey' and other communications, many have shared their feelings on how the church should act and there are certainly differing points of view. The challenge for us all to put our own desires aside for what may be better for the greater good. Church leadership has been considering what is in the best interest of the entire congregation and we will continue to do that. Church leadership collectively misses regular activities and in-person worship just as much as all of our members. We need to embrace that understanding more than ever to allow us to overcome these unforeseen challenges. We are all one in Christ.

Finally, brothers and sisters, rejoice! Strive for full restoration, encourage one another, be of one mind, live in peace. And the God of love and peace will be with you. ~2 Corinthians 13:11

None of the decisions that have been made have been easy and, as you can imagine, there have been passionate and heartfelt discussions. Council and church leadership has been united throughout the process while being conscious and considerate to the needs of the entire congregation and membership. Faith and trust in God have driven every decision that has been made. And every decision that has been made is subject to change based on things that are not in our control.

The following is what I feel we need to focus on as we approach what we hope is the beginning of a methodical approach to returning to what we all want, which is coming back together as a church family, in-person. These are the things that have been front of mind for these many months of decision making. It has been a balancing act of not putting people in harms way and keeping the desires of the congregation as a priority.

As we move forward we will need *patience*, *understanding*, *empathy*, *mutual-respect*, *confidence in God*, and *service* (but with a little more emphasis on patience). The related scriptures reflect what God would have us consider.

With regards to patience, for those of you who know me well, it is something that I struggle with. I want to be clear about this because I am talking to myself as well as to all of you. I know my limitations, which are many, and this is one of them. I know that we can work through this area together.

Patience

We all need to be patient in life and especially now. Without patience, it is impossible to serve God. In our challenges and temptation, we must remain undeterred and focused on our service to God. Patience is the ability to hold back and persevere through all forms of temptations and trials. In our anger, frustration, and suffering, we must be patient and trust God. This is one of the qualities we need to maintain as Christians.

Having said all that, the exact phrase, "patience is a virtue" is not in the Bible. It is a figure of speech used many years ago to illustrate patience as one of the virtues of Christians.

The following are verses from Scripture that relate to patience and may help us all work through this together:

Be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord. ~Psalm 27:14

You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what He has promised. ~Hebrews 10:36

But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently. ~Romans 8:25

Understanding

Understanding does not only mean to comprehend what someone is saying or doing. When using understanding as an adjective, it means "sympathetically aware of other people's feelings; tolerant and forgiving".

Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails. ~Proverbs 19:21

Empathy

Empathy is the ability to sense other people's emotions, coupled with the ability to imagine what someone else might be thinking or feeling.

Try to do what is good for others, not just what is good for yourselves. ~*I Corinthians*

A Note from Pastor Matt


...patience, understanding, empathy, mutual-respect, confidence in God, and service... That sounds like another set of Heroic Lutheran traits to me! :) (maybe for Lent 2022?)

We are working to take steps to get back to in-person worship. We will begin OUTDOOR worship in the parking lot on Sunday mornings, starting May 2, at 10:30 AM.

In the last year I have targeted three different dates for when I hoped we might be able to begin limited, in-person worship in the building. Every time I thought I had found a date, cases have started to go up at an accelerating rate. And this has happened again. The tentative date in my mind now is that perhaps we could begin as early as Sunday, May 23. Now, that date has not been discussed by the Board of Worship Life, and would require Council approval. So, we will discuss. The one thing that is different now is that MANY of our regular attendees have been vaccinated. We will still have to wear masks, and take all of the necessary precautions. But, maybe? My selfish goal since the beginning of all this has been to not do anything that would get people killed. Your safety is what matters to me. My faith tells me that, yes, God would be glorified by our worshipping together in-person. But, do you know what would bring God even more glory? If we were all still alive when this is over! Maybe vaccines that are 90% effective change that? Maybe I should be willing to take the smaller risk of getting someone killed. Would that bring God glory? ... I am glad we have a Congregation Council to make these difficult decisions! So, we will discuss.

If that date doesn't work, I am sure I'll pick another for hope's sake. Regardless of what happens with that May 23rd date, we WILL begin having outdoor worship at 10:30 AM in the parking lot (as long as it's not raining sideways) on Sundays beginning May 2. And we will still have the entire service produced beforehand and available on Facebook and YouTube.

But, the GOOD NEWS is that, when all this is over, the tomb will still be empty! Jesus will still be Risen! *Alleluia!*


