The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.
(1 Kings 17:16 NRSV)

Jesus, taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, gave thanks and broke the loaves.

Then he gave them to his disciples to distribute to the people.

He also divided the two fish among them all.

They all ate and were satisfied.

(Mark 6:41-42 NIV)

The scriptures above were the Daily Texts for today, June 10, as I write this. There is so much here that can apply to our world today. But what strikes me as the primary message from this that we all need to hear is abundance. In First Kings, the widow of Zarepath knew that she did not have enough meal or enough oil for her family to survive, **but God** made sure that there was enough, so much that her containers were never emptied. In the Gospel of Mark, In the story of feeding the 5,000, Jesus's disciples knew that there were not nearly enough provisions around to feed the crowds that had been following Jesus, **but God** made sure that there was enough, so much that the left overs filled twelve baskets.

But God. These two words describe our faith, and abundance is only a part of it. We think there won't be enough *fill in the blank*, **but God** always provides more than enough. We think we are not worthy to be called children of God, **but God** says yes, yes you are, and claims us as beloved in baptism. And today, some might even wonder if we are ever going to get through this time of pandemic, **but God** will make sure that the people of God will continue to share the good news of God's Word and Love with ALL people. God will provide a way for us.

Leading worship for Sunday from our Sanctuary gave me such a jolt of energy. I cannot wait for the day that church can once again look and feel like church. I know that you are all looking forward to the time when we can all be together again for in-person worship. There is a letter starting **on page 4** of this newsletter from the Congregation Council detailing our **REOPENING PLAN** and what worship will have to look like if we choose to open for worship while the virus is still actively spreading in our community. There is no date set yet. Our council is in agreement that we would rather be the church that opens late, and misses out on a couple weeks when we *could* have had in-person worship, than the church that opens too early, and gets people infected or even killed.

A Financial Update

Right now, we are facing so many unknowns that many of us might feel overwhelmed just by the pandemic that has overshadowed everything. Sometimes it is all I can do just to grocery shop. But life goes on, and you may be wondering how things are financially at Bethlehem.

Well, you know me, I trust that God is a) taking us where we need to go, b) giving us what we need to get there, and c) providing us opportunities along the way to grow. However, for those of you who like to make your own determination, I have prepared the following.

Leadership anticipated that this would be a tough year financially, just as last year was, and maybe the year before. I really do not remember which was the first year Stewardship & Finance decided to recommend a

deficit budget. But we knew when we expanded our staffing to include a parish administrator, we were facing several years of struggle. And while the advantages of Laurey's contributions far outweigh the cost, the cost still exists.

Thus far this year, our general offerings are down just over \$26,000.00 over last year which is reflected in a commensurate reduction in operating income. Our operating expenses are also down, but only by about \$7,500.00. Our actual shortfall of operating income over expenses is \$17,956.90.

As you may recall, we determined early on that we would continue to pay our staff during the crisis, and we have accomplished that goal. We have continued to maintain the building, we continue to serve our neighbors through the food bank, and we continue to serve and worship 'together' apart. I have said it before, but it bears repeating, our mission and ministry continue through this time.

Through the diligence of our Parish Administrator and Congregation President, Bethlehem secured a

forgivable loan of \$38,700.00. As long as we monitor the expenditure of these funds utilizing them according to the loan guidelines the loan will not have to be repaid. This is a heavy load off the shoulders of our financial leadership.

Our predecessors also deserve a note of thanks. Through the foresight of past leadership, we have over \$36,000.00 in a set-aside certificate of deposit for emergencies. We have an endowment fund of over \$200,000.00 on which to draw during times of financial hardship or for the ongoing improvement of our church and mission. We have monies set aside for capital improvements which will be utilized in part to replace our boiler. We have savings of just over \$51,000.00 that can be utilized for immediate cash flow issues while still protecting the special funds for seminarians, Faith, Family, Fun day, food pantry, and outreach baskets.

I do not know what the future holds. I have no idea when we will be able to worship together in-person again, and I have no idea what that will look like. I know there will be costs to re-opening of both a financial and emotional nature. I pray that we come out on the other side stronger.

Dear friends in Christ,

The Bethlehem Lutheran Congregation Council has been meeting regularly since the beginning of the Coronavirus pandemic to continue to address the full function of the church during our time away. There has been a great deal of research done to determine how Bethlehem can resume in-person worship services once the Michigan Safe Start Plan guidelines recommend it. The Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church (BELC) Re-opening Plan has been created and adopted unanimously by Council based on the following:

This plan is guided by our values for protecting God-created life using guidance from the following:

- ♦ Centers for Disease Control (CDC)
- ♦ The MI Safe Start Plan
- ♦ Michigan County Health Officials
- ♦ Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)
- ♦ North/West Lower Michigan Synod ELCA

Creating a realistic and safe plan to re-open our beloved church and once again worship together is not an easy task. It is also not a task that is taken lightly as the most important consideration is the health, safety, and well-being of our congregation. The intent of this letter is to inform you of where Bethlehem is as of today in this plan (Phase 4) and then what the next phase would look like (Phase 5).

Council voted to approve two resolutions that involve the following:

- 1. Approval of the Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church Re-opening Plan.
- 2. Agreeing that Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church may not immediately return to in-person worship at such time as the Michigan Safe Start Plan allows gatherings of no more than fifty (50) people.

As stated earlier, the following is where we are today as a church in Phase 4 of the Re-opening Plan.

BELC blueprint for **Phase 4**, as it relates to the MI Safe Start Plan providing the following guidance:

- ♦ No in-person worship services.
- ♦ In-building staff should follow the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Policy drafted by the BELC Parish Administrator.
- Pastor may resume live-streaming worship service from the sanctuary either alone, or with a small support group (pastor's discretion).
- ♦ No in-sanctuary singing (if pastor is preaching from the sanctuary).
 - ♦ Continue with music via technology with our music ministry members.
- ♦ Church Congregation Council, boards and committees should continue to meet online.
- ♦ Bible studies should continue to meet online.
- ♦ High-risk individuals should continue to shelter in place, whether staff or volunteers.
- ♦ Life rituals (weddings, funerals, baptisms) will not be held in the church.
 - ♦ Graveside committals of less than ten (10) people may be done at the pastor's discretion with appropriate social distancing and face masks.
 - ♦ Outdoor weddings of five (5) people may be done at the pastor's discretion with appropriate social distancing and face masks.

The following is what would be required to return to in-person worship services in Phase 5 of the Re-opening Plan.

BELC blueprint for **Phase 5**, as it relates to the MI Safe Start Plan providing the following guidance:

- ♦ In-person worship service for no more than fifty (50) people.
- ♦ There are recommendations that for churches with over fifty (50) average worship attendance (AWA) like BELC, to continue holding live-streaming worship service.
- Should the decision be made to hold in-person worship services, it would require the following:
 - Maintain live-streaming of the worship service for those that may not be ready to engage in large groups, as well as high risk members.
 - Multiple worship times.
- ♦ Sanctuary and all common areas must be sanitized before and after each worship service.
- Research needs to be done to determine the best way to sanitize the cloth pew cushions so they dry in between services.
 - ♦ Consider using plastic coverings for easier cleaning and faster drying.
 - ♦ Consider Sunday and a mid-week service.
 - ♦ If there are multiple worship services on Sunday, there will need to be several hours in between for sanitization and drying time. (continued on page 5)

- People might have to sign up for worship services to control numbers.
- Consider assigned seating.
- Social distancing in all directions (6').
- Cordon off alternating pews for social distancing (6').
- Set up chairs in the social hall with social distancing (6').
- All elements will be removed from the pews (Bibles/hymnals/pew envelopes/communion cards/Simply Giving cards, etc.)
- No printed bulletins.
 - ♦ Utilize the projection screen for the entire service.
- No water in the baptismal font.
- Do not offer children's activity bags (in narthex).
- Sanitization would need to be done after every worship service including: (following CDC guidelines)
 - ♦ Sanctuary
 - ♦ Pews
 - ♦ All door handles/pull/knobs/microphones/sound board/keyboards/floors/bathrooms/chairs in social hall.
- Hand sanitizer stations will need to be purchased and offered in different locations in the entryway, upper greeting area, narthex, and in the sanctuary.
- Social distancing on the altar by officiants (6').
- No acolyte
- No nursery.
- No choir.
 - ♦ Continue with music via technology with our music ministry members.
 - ♦ No singing by attendees.
 - ♦ No visiting instrumentalists or soloists.
 - ♦ Organist/pianist may play.
- No traditional communion.
 - ♦ Offer the sacrament in word only as suggested by the Bishop.
 - ♦ Allow people to schedule an appointment with Pastor(s) for communion.
- No "passing the peace".
 - ♦ Pastor(s) can create a verbal message that the congregation can respond to all with.
- Face masks will be worn.
 - Will need to purchase disposable face masks for those people that forget their face mask, or do not feel they need one.
 - * Ushers may turn people away if they refuse to use face masks.
 - * Need to have a place available for those who are unable to wear one due to a medical condition. (This is allowable in the Governor's Executive Order, however, those people may be asked to wait until Phase 6 to attend in-person).
- Set up a designated collection area for the offering to be deposited in.
 - No traditional gathering of offerings.
 - Designated area for special offering Sunday's will need to be determined for:
 - * Food Bank Sunday
 - * Pine Ridge Mission Sunday
 - * Lansing SAVE Sunday
- No coffee/fellowship time.
 - ♦ Remove the coffee display to eliminate the opportunity for someone to make coffee.
 - ♦ High-risk individuals should/may continue to shelter in place, whether staff or volunteers.
 - ♦ Consideration of Council, Mutual Ministry, boards, committees and small groups meeting in-person with social distancing (6').
 - * Face masks will be worn.
 - ♦ Life rituals (weddings, funerals, baptisms) may be considered with no more than fifty (50) people.
 - * This total to include the pastor, musicians and wedding party.



Council will continue to monitor changing guidelines on a daily basis to be informed with the most up to date information available.

Rest assured that we will keep you apprised of the progression of this unprecedented process.
