If you attend the 8:15 service, please indicate if you would like the prayer repeated at both services.
- The Blue Card: provided if you would like your concern prayed for every day this week. Please fill out this card and place it in the basket in our prayer corner, located in the back of the church.

Adult sized chairs are provided for parental supervision. Activity bags, filled with coloring/activity books, crayons and sewing cards can be found on the front pew and in the Narthex at the back of the church. If you need to leave with your child, please use the exit door to the left of the keyboard. The unstaffed nursery, located at the northeast corner of the lower level, is available as a crying room. Diaper changing stations are located in each of the main level restrooms and in the nursery.



Living God's Mission



Our theme for the 2019-20 program year is "Living God's Mission." We will be exploring each of the five areas in our Mission Plan, focusing on the stated objectives in each area. We will also emphasize how our Purpose Statement and Guiding Principles tie in, as well as the faith practices that are our Marks of Discipleship. And we will even fit in some of the

Building Blocks for A Lifetime of Stewardship along the way! This week our area of emphasis in our Mission Plan is:

Community Ministry (Outreach)

Goal: Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church will actively seek and develop community connections with residents, faith communities, schools, and other organizations and will be a resource for community activity. We will do this by:

- Expanding the use of the church building for community activities
- Emphasizing ministries addressing basic needs
- Working collaboratively with neighborhood organizations
- Encouraging members to increase engagement with neighborhood residents and our community

Family Growth Center Holiday Gift Workshop

Gifts given to this project will help low-income parents who attend the programs of FGC to select gifts for each of their children. Often these parents would not be able to purchase gifts to give their children. This is an important chance to build their self-esteem and make the holiday season joyful. There is a Christmas tree in the social hall with gift tags on it. Please take a tag from the tree, purchase the gift, return the <u>unwrapped</u> gift and tag to the church, place it in the container in the social hall.
