PARISH NOTES

WE CELEBRATE THE FESTIVAL OF REFORMATION

Luther's hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is our God", is traditionally sung on this day. The official day of the Reformation is on October 31. The fact that Reformation Day coincides with Halloween may not be mere coincidence. Halloween, being the Eve of All Saints' Day, might have been an entirely appropriate day for Luther to post his 95 Theses against indulgences; since the castle church would be open on All Saints' Day, specifically for people to view a large collection of relics. The viewing of these relics was said to promise a reduction in time in purgatory, similar to that of the purchase of an indulgence. Dr. Luther may have been shrewd in his choice of that day to post his Theses. Today, we no longer emphasize the differences between the Lutheran Church and the Roman Catholic Church. However, we do seek to consider how reform is necessary in our individual lives and in the life of the Church.

- 1. Recipients must be either a member or actively involved in BELC activities.
- Recipients must be in grades Kindergarten through 5th grade and currently attend school in the Lansing School District.
 (Note: students in 3rd grade that attend Lewton School, Post Oak Academy or Wexford Montessori won't be included in the program until the 2020-2021 school year.)
- 3. The child's name, address and school must be submitted to the BELC office to be cleared for inclusion. (This happens with the help of the City of Lansing.)






