Thank you!

I began the January *Bethlehem Star* with a thank you to Amanda Schneider for her years of service as Handbell Choir Director, and I am beginning February with a thank you to the congregation. At our Congregational meeting on Sunday, January 26, Bethlehem approved a sabbatical for me that will begin April 13 (Easter Monday) and go through July 6. I trust that I, and the congregation, will be richly blessed by this experience. THANK YOU!!!

The focus of my sabbatical will be on Health and Wellness, Contemplative Prayer, and Congregational Vitality. In preparation for the third area I will be attending a Congregational Vitality Workshop sponsored by the ELCA in San Diego, February 19-22. From this workshop, readings during sabbatical, and visits to various congregations I will bring back to Bethlehem my thoughts on our own mission and ministry.

Another way my sabbatical is connecting with God's mission and ministry at Bethlehem is in my focus on Prayer. Our theme this year as a congregation during Lent will be Prayer. If **you** have an experience in your own life of prayer that you would be willing to share during one of our Wednesday Lenten Services, please speak with me or Pastor John as soon as possible. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 27, so it will be here before we know it.

Living God's Mission

As a sign of our vitality, we are continuing our exploration of our Mission Plan, Living God's Mission. Each week we are focusing on one of the five areas identified in our Mission Plan; Being Christ-Centered, Caring for our Faith Community, Youth Ministry, Community Ministry (Outreach), and Evangelism. You will see the focus for each Sunday listed on the church calendar with the letters "LGM:", which stands for Living God's Mission. Then, in worship each week, the bulletin gives more information on that week's area of focus. We may include it in the sermon, or in the Thought for the Week, in the prayers, in some other way in the service, or in a combination of ways.

We want to keep this in front of the congregation in this way because THESE are the areas your Mission Planning Team identified for us to explore as we move ahead together in God's mission. And, while it is our mission plan, we must remember, we don't own it, we don't



have a mission; it is God's mission that has us! That is why we are using the title Living God's Mission.

Our various boards have been hard at work exploring the ways each of these five areas of the Mission Plan connects with their particular areas of ministry, paying special attention to the recommended actions from the Mission Planning Team, as well as celebrating all the ways Bethlehem is already living out God's mission.

ENDOWMENT AT RECORD HIGH

At the end of the year the Endowment Fund has realized it's most successful period in its history. The funds donated to the fund are used to buy dividend producing, high quality stocks and tax free bonds. This year over \$6,800.00 in dividends have been received. \$13,500.00 is available to the congregation for use in four areas; Capital improvements, mission, outreach, and scholarships. In the last five years \$26,000.00 has been given to various congregational needs; most recently for improvements to the Mission House and expenses for Faith Family Fun Day. The current value of the portfolio is \$216,372.00.

COMMUNITY PUBLIC HUMAN TRAFFICKING EVENT TO BE HELD AT BETHLEHEM

Human trafficking is a form of modern slavery that occurs in every state, including Michigan. It is the business of stealing freedom for profits. In some cases, traffickers trick, defraud or physically force victims into providing commercial sex. In others, victims are lied to, assaulted, threatened or manipulated into working under inhumane, illegal or otherwise unacceptable conditions. Perpetrators of human trafficking span all racial, ethnic, and gender demographics and are as diverse as the survivors. Some use their privilege, wealth, and power which include individuals, business owners, members of a gang or network, parents or family members of victims, intimate partners, owners of farms or restaurants and powerful corporate executives of government representatives. There is no one specific description of a human trafficker. It is a multi-billion-dollar criminal industry that denies freedom to **24.9 million people** around the world. It is no longer a "white van" problem. In Michigan, human trafficking is also prevalent at events like Art Prize, the Detroit auto show and many large, and small-scale sporting events. It has become widespread throughout our state and the statistics are growing at a rapid pace. As a community we need to become more aware of what we, the average citizen, can do to help protect those around us who are most vulnerable. We need to equip ourselves with the information that is needed to effectively recognize what may be occurring right where we live. On Saturday, February 29th at 2:00 p.m., Bethlehem will be hosting a public community event that will feature a film titled "Break the Chain." This is a documentary produced and directed by Michigan filmmakers and is a multi-award-winning feature length documentary film that addresses the often "hidden in plain sight" issue of Human Trafficking within Michigan and the United States. The film chronicles two survivors of human trafficking and provides a detailed look at how trafficking goes unnoticed within our own backyards. We will also have a speaker from the Michigan Human Trafficking Task Force from Osceola county who will speak about her experiences as she works to end human trafficking. We are also working with our Lansing's Chief of police, Daryl Green, LPD social workers and our community policing officer to touch on Human Trafficking in our area. Due to the subject matter of this event and the film, we must request that no children under the age of 14 be in attendance. We hope you will be able to make this date a priority and join us.
