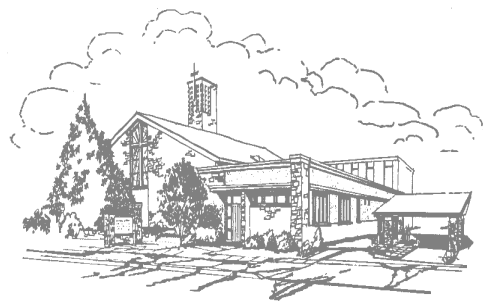

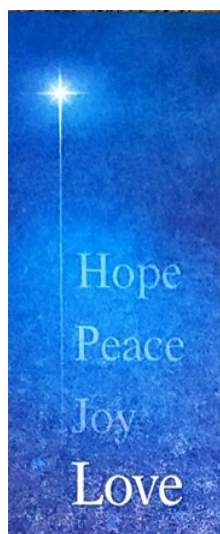

Welcome to a New Church Year

In December this year we begin the Year of Matthew. Starting with the First Sunday of Advent, we will be focusing on Matthew's Gospel. Here Jesus is presented as the one who fulfills God's mission first given to Abraham to bless all peoples. Events in Jesus' life are said to happen in order to fulfill what is written in the Scriptures. Jesus also steps into the role of Moses, revealing in five sermons the life God intends for us, deepening and expanding what was commanded in the first five books of the Hebrew Scriptures. In spite of this insistence on a "higher righteousness (Matthew 5:17-48), it is forgiveness from God and for one another that marks the community and holds it together. The Gospel according to Matthew contains riches that will be a blessing to us in the coming months.



...and Welcome to Advent



In Advent we are invited to slow our pace and experience God with us. If we take time to pause and reflect, we will have an opportunity to see God more clearly. When you take time to reflect on your life and talk to God, what do you see? In Advent we focus on the gifts of **Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love**. Where do you see these gifts in your day-to-day experience? The business of this time can blind us to these gifts if we don't slow down. We invite you to observe Advent with us as part of your spiritual practice in preparation for the birth of our Savior.

One thing you might consider is using an Advent Wreath this year. When you light the candles, pause to reflect on where you see Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love in your world. You could do this with your family each week, perhaps before an evening meal. And we invite you to use the 2019 Weekly Advent Devotions from Deacon Tammy Devine (Pastor Matt's Spiritual Director), available on the welcome table at the church or by following the link below.

Adult Forum – The Letter of James

During Adult Forum we will explore the Letter of James. Credible tradition names James, the brother of Jesus, as the writer. This James along with others in his family resisted Jesus' mission. Following the resurrection and the events of Pentecost, however, James became the head of the Church in Jerusalem, earning a reputation for integrity and devotion even among non-Christian Jews. James was likely martyred in 62 CE.

Our discussion will include the relationship between faith and action; possessions and status; friendship with the world versus friendship with God, and the struggle to tame the tongue with its capacity to cause great harm.

The letter reflects the Old Testament "Wisdom" writings of Proverbs and Ecclesiastes and draws heavily on the teachings of Jesus, especially the Sermon on the Mount. It was likely written at a time when many, if not most, Jewish Christians had fled Jerusalem and Judea due to deadly persecution of Jesus' followers.

Our discussion will begin with finding patience and wisdom in the midst of trials. We might even get to the impact on our lives of truly listening to God

Please join us in the Library between services as often as you can, so that together we might receive the Word of God, the Word of Life.

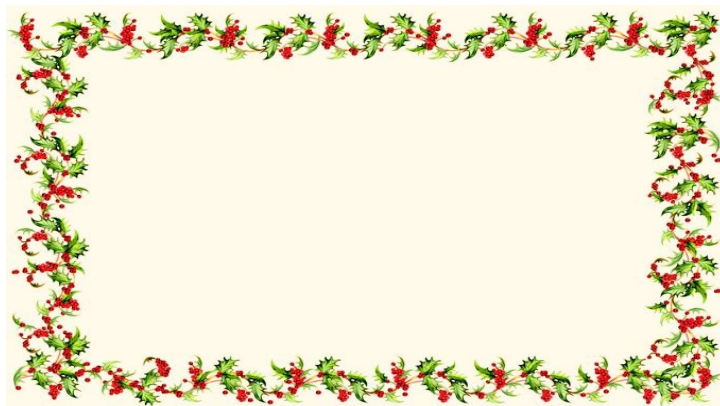
