SUNDAY WORSHIP As you have heard, council decided to start hosting worship in the parking lot on Sunday mornings for at least five Sundays, beginning September 13, weather permitting. As is true with most of our 'returns to normal', this will be a hybrid of safe social distancing, under a tent, as well as distancing by remaining in your vehicle. Our plan is to distribute pre-packaged communion elements, having those who wish to be outdoors bring chairs, using the FM broadcast for those who wish to stay safely in their cars. GOD'S WORK OUR HANDS Next Sunday, September 13, we will be hosting the annual God's work, our hands event. This year, since we will be in outdoor worship at the church, we thought to keep our efforts close to home. So we will be cleaning up Clifford Park which is directly across Mt. Hope from our building. If there are enough volunteers, we will split into two groups and work at the park recently created on Isbell. If more hands are available, we will work on cleaning up the church lot. This will be low-key so we might have a chance to visit with a church friend we haven't seen in a while. Plastic gloves and trash bags will be supplied. It is also a way for our neighbors to see we are still active and invested in the community.

NEW/USED ORGAN! Confident that we WILL worship together in person, using monies approved by the Memorial Fund, last Saturday Bethlehem purchased a used Allen Organ at auction for \$1,900.00. This is a great replacement for our current Conn Organ from the 1950s that is on its last breaths. New, a comparable organ would have cost Bethlehem \$30-50,000. The purchase includes a speaker system that should work well in our sanctuary. There will be some additional moving, installation, and tuning costs. It is in excellent working condition from the mid-eighties. What a wonderful addition this will be for our music ministry!

<u>LWR QUILTS AND KITS</u> We learned that in addition to the devastating loss of life, injuries and widespread damage caused by the Beirut explosion, three containers of LWR Quilts and Kits amounting to more than 47,000 items were also destroyed. These items were at the port of Beirut, on their way to families hit hard by the increasingly dire economic situation in Lebanon, including refugee families who fled conflict in Syria.
